Goals	The course aims to provide students with historical and historiographic knowledge of non-Western architecture with focus on the Islamic lands.				
Learning Outcomes	<p>1. Knowledge of non-Western architecture with focus on the Islamic lands from the 6th century to the present.</p> <p>2. Understanding of architectural history as part of cultural history and extension of socio-religious and intellectual history.</p> <p>3. Gaining familiarity with non-Western architectural historiography.</p>				
Course Content	An introduction to non-Western Architecture with the main focus on architecture of the historical Lands of Islam from the 6th century to the present, the course is intended to give a general survey of the architectural culture of the Islamic world with an emphasis on architectural expression in comparative context with Western and other non-Western traditions in its historical and geographical dimensions. Questions of cultural identity, influence, interactions, and divergences of artistic production, materiality and patronage will be investigated. The question of historiography in its diverse dimensions in contrast to Western-centered narratives will also be an important issue addressed throughout the course.
